		Biblical Note: Day (Evening and Morning) The word "day" is from the Hebrew word "yom." There are three interpretations concerning the use of the word "day" in Creation. First, the days of Creation refer to extended geological ages prior to man's presence on earth. Second, the days are 24-hour periods in which God revealed His creative acts. Third, they are literal 24-hour days of divine activity. The third interpretation is supported by the fact that the phrase "the evening and morning" qualifies the length of the day. See: Genesis 1:5,8,13,19,23,31; 2:2

		Biblical Note: Waters Above The phrase "waters which are above the firmament" refers to atmospheric water that were

above the land. This suggests that before the Flood, there had been a dense moisture

enshrouding the earth. There are three views concerning the meaning of the waters above the firmament. First, the simplest explanation of waters above the expanse seems to be clouds.

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(Proverbs 8:28). Second, some believe that this is a poetic description of the rain reservoirs in God's lofty abode (Psalm 104:13). Third, this view suggests that the waters above are referring to a water vapor canopy that was above the earth prior to the Flood of Noah. This canopy trapped the sun's rays more effectively than our present atmosphere does and gave a semi-tropical climate to every part of the world. It is from this canopy that the waters for the Flood came. The problem with this view is that the waters above seemed to have existed after the Flood (Psalm 148:4-6).
