## II. The Anointing of David (1 Samuel 16:1-23)

### A. The Lord's Choice (1 Samuel 16:1-13)

- The Lord calls Samuel to take a horn of oil and go to Bethlehem.
- The Lord has chosen for himself a king among the sons of Jesse.
- Samuel is concerned that Saul will kill him, so the Lord directed Samuel to go sacrifice there.
- He invites Jesse and his sons to the feast and assumes that Eliab is the chosen one.

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- The Lord rejects Eliab and tells Samuel that he looks at the heart not the appearance.
- Samuel inquires if there are anymore sons, since the Lord did not choose any of the others.
- Jesse said his youngest son was tending the sheep and Samuel called for him.
- When David makes his appearance, the Lord tells Samuel to anoint him with oil.
- The writer records that the Spirit of the Lord came upon David from that day forward.

### B. David Serves Saul (1 Samuel 16:14-23)

- The writer records that the Spirit of Lord departed from Saul.
- An evil spirit was permitted by the Lord to torment Saul.
- His servants advised that a skilled musician be found to play for Saul.
- Someone recommended David to be chosen as the musician.
- Saul sent word to Jesse that he required David.
- Jesse sent David with an offering and he play for Saul when he was tormented.
